

Parent Questionnaire results Spring 2024

 Response: Celebrating the ways in which the children demonstrate the Core Values is important. All classes will be reminded nominate children for Good citizen's award.
- 'More opportunities to get together as a school community could be a better sense of community at the school and a clearer idea of where the school is headed and aims' (3 responses)
 - Response: We agree that it is vital to arrange opportunities for parents to attend in order to strengthen our community. Fortunately, the 'Welcome back' picnic will be taking place in September. Several parents have requested workshops on methods used in maths, vision and direction of the school. These sessions will be held in person in the evenings to enable working parents to attend. On a Tuesday, parents are welcome to attend the weekly worship session which is held in St Nicholas church. During the Celebration session, parents can come and look at the children's books, speak to teachers and see the child's new classroom. This year the session will take place on Tuesday 9th July. At the end of each term, there is a church service. There will be an opportunity for parents meet after the service when refreshments will be served.
- 'Maybe some wider options into music lessons this maybe our lack of knowledge' (1 response)
 Response: Within the music curriculum, all children participate in weekly music lessons covers a range of music from classical to rock and roll. Composing using tuned instruments, e.g. glockenspiel. There is also a recorder club for Year 3 children. Individual music lessons are also provided by external teachers for the piano and flute.
- ➤ 'Drop off in the morning would be perfect if the doors open at 8:35am' (1 response)

 Response: The school gate opens at 8.40am in the mornings. Fortunately, there is a breakfast club option which could be explored. The club starts at 7.30am.
- How are the school rules enforced? (3 responses)

 Response:Our school rules are: Be Kind, Be Safe and Be Responsible. Systems, which outlined in the Behaviour policy, are followed when a child is treated unkindly through words or actions. Children are encouraged to speak to a member of staff straight away. If a child needs support to develop personal or social skills, staff provides guidance and monitors interactions. Our Pastoral Lead also works with families to ensure consistency in approach.

As a school, we believe that working closely with parents is the best way to support children. We have an open-door policy, finding time to deal with the issues that matter to our parents – no matter how big or small. We would like to encourage parents to contact the class teachers to discuss their child's personal, social and academic needs.
