The School

The School will:

- Provide a safe, caring environment which emphasises our Christian ethos
- Help children to develop a positive attitude to others, regardless of age, disability, gender, race, religion or belief, relationships
- Value all children and celebrate their personal and academic achievements
- Reinforce the school rules of being kind, safe and responsible
- Encourage implementation of the Behaviour Policy by providing opportunities for children to develop positive social relationships, self-esteem and a sense of responsibility
- Encourage children to care for and respect their school environment
- Provide high quality teaching and learning experiences
- Deliver a broad, balanced and stimulating curriculum
- Provide children with regular and appropriate homework
- Encourage **all** children to fulfil their potential
- Keep parents informed of children's schooling and development through regular parent consultation meetings and annual reports
- Communicate relevant information, in a timely manner
- Respect the confidentiality of information regarding every child
- Provide opportunities for their involvement in school life

The Child

- Work hard during lessons to develop my abilities and full potential
- Be friendly and helpful
- Be polite and respectful of all adults and my peers
- Be respectful of others' property and belongings and take care of school equipment, buildings and grounds
- Know what is acceptable behaviour and understand the consequences of unacceptable behaviour
- Complete home learning tasks on time and to the best of my ability

- Be proud and respectful of my school uniform and wear it correctly, adhering to the school uniform policy
- Tell a member of staff if I am worried, unhappy or need help

The Parent/Carer/Guardian

I/We will:

- Promote and support the school's overall aims and Christian values;-encouraging my/our child to develop a positive attitude by showing kindness, respect and consideration towards every member of this community and beyond
- Respect the confidentiality of every child
- Support my/our child's progress by continuing to talk to them about their learning and achievement in lessons
- Work with and support the school to ensure that the behaviour policies of the school are maintained
- Keep staff informed of any aspects of my/our child's life (e.g. any changes in family circumstances) which might affect his or her work or personal wellbeing.
- Read carefully and respond, if necessary, to all communications promptly (e.g. website, letters, emails)
- Attend meetings whenever possible
- Communicate via appropriate channels (e.g. messages at the gate, email or phone the office) and at appropriate times, in a fair and considerate manner, respectful of all parties
- Refrain from expressing negative/personal opinions with regard to any aspect of school life on Social Media
- Support the school approach to on-line safety (e.g. age appropriate content/ games) and not deliberately upload any text, image, sound or videos that could upset or offend any member of the school community
- Ensure that my/our child attends school regularly and arrives by 8:55 a.m.
- Inform the school of any absence, with an explanation for this, before 9 a.m.
- Collect my/our child promptly at 3.15 p.m.
- Avoid taking my/our child out of school for holiday leave during the school term
- Adhere to Public Health Advice in terms of sickness
- Book any medical appointments around the school day where possible
- Ensure my/our child is prepared for school with the necessary equipment: reading book and reading record, P.E. kit, homework, pencil case and water bottle
- Ensure my/our child always wears the correct uniform and has appropriate PE/games kit
- Encourage the timely completion of homework and home learning activities and help when appropriate
- Endeavour (through volunteering and fundraising) to support the school, the Governors and the PTA in all their activities to maintain and enhance the provision within school

Please sign the accompanying School Home Agreement Form. Your child will be invited to sign when he/she reaches Year 2. The School Home Agreement will be reviewed annually for signing.

Our Governing Body will carry out their legal responsibilities to the school and ensure that:
